

# **About the Museum**

Jinguashi used to be a major producer of gold and copper ore in Taiwan. After the mines closed down, many remnants of the mining industry and old buildings were left behind. In 2004, the New Taipei City Gold Museum was established to facilitate the preservation of the heritage sites of mining culture in the Shueinandong-Jinguashi- Jiufen region and to promote relevant education. The Gold Museum is the first mining heritage museum in Taiwan.
